NORTH ZONE GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. **STALL FEES and SEASON PASSES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.**
2. All athletes (riders) and owners must provide proof of valid 2024 EC Sport License and a valid PSO membership (OE/Cheval Quebec etc.). Proof of membership must be provided prior to competing at all events. All athletes (riders) and owners must be current members in good standing before the competition for points to apply and remain in good standing all year long. As per EC rules, points may not be assigned retroactively.
3. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See rules of Equestrian Canada Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
4. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
5. All Junior athletes (riders) must provide a copy of their birth certificate prior to competing at the first show.
6. Amateur riders must have a valid "Amateur Status" designation as shown on EC membership card.
Silver rated divisions: Sport License required, Horse Recording required.
Bronze rated divisions: Bronze Sport License required, Horse Recording not required.
Temporary Competition Upgrades may be purchased in the office but are good for one event only and no points can be awarded.
7. Season's Pass Holders (pass applies to Horse) may enter any TWO divisions per weekend plus the age-appropriate equitation on the flat or medal and one specialty class (derby/grand prix/model & performance). Season's Pass Holders will receive one stall included but all other fees and charges must be paid by VISA, MC, E-Transfer or open cheque to be left in horse show office prior to receiving competition back numbers.
8. **Entry Form and Stabling Form must be submitted 30 days prior to the first day of each show, respectively, to avoid a post-entry fee. Enter at horseshowsonline.com.** All entries must submit a stabling request form and entry form for each competition. Season Pass holders will have priority stabling. Stable request forms must be submitted to christine@horsemanshipociety.org. All forms must be filled out and signed by the competitor and a parent or guardian if the competitor is under the age of 18.
9. Any horse entered in any class at this competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location as per EC Rule A602.5.
10. All unpaid fees will be considered an outstanding account until paid in full. Any outstanding accounts will be reported to EC 30 days after September 30, 2024.
11. All accounts must be settled before the next competition, or entries will be denied, and no points awarded. Please note that any outstanding accounts at year-end will not be eligible to compete in the Playoffs/Championships.
12. NSF cheques: \$50.00 bank penalty charges will be added to all accounts paid with cheques that are returned from the bank for any reason.
13. Competition management reserves the right to change or amend show scheduling up to one hour prior to the designated class.
14. Veterinarian and/or Farrier bills incurred at the horse show (medical emergencies, farm calls etc.) must be settled the day the costs are incurred unless the service provider allows otherwise. All unpaid bills to the series "on-call veterinarian" will result in an outstanding account for the competitor, thus the competitor will not be able to compete at any Silver Series Show nor the championships until their account has been paid in full.

15. A \$50.00 + HST fee will be charged to ALL exhibitors whose stall is not cleaned prior to their departure from the show.
16. Competition numbers must always be worn and visible.
17. Dogs must be kept on a leash or tied at stabling area at all times. There will be a \$50.00 loose dog fee for the first violation and competitors will be asked to leave the show grounds with no refund for the second violation.
18. After unloading, all horse trailers must be moved immediately to the designated parking area.
19. Formal show attire, including jacket is required for all Hunter Divisions, Equitation/Medal Competitions and Jumper Classics or specialty Jumper Competitions. Jumper riders may wear collared, single-colour polo shirts for all other competitions. Hoodies, sleeveless shirts and shirts other than polos are not permitted. Rain gear/cold weather gear permitted upon management approval.
20. Approved headgear: all competitors must wear proper fitting, ASTM approved protective head gear, with the safety harness correctly secured while mounted in competition or on event grounds.
21. Competition Rings will not be held due to trainer conflicts for flat classes and/or course walks. Coaches are expected to arrange their schedules with In-Gate staff. A priority ring will be assigned/announced each day of competition.
22. Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible and the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, or rider, or horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition (A602.7). It is the responsibility of all the individuals participating in any capacity in the EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any imposed by the competition. Do not participate in the EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.
23. Riders will not be penalized in hunter or equitation competitions for wearing a properly fitting safety vest or inflatable safety vest.
24. No hors concours entries will be permitted.
25. The competition organizer reserves the right to refuse entries.



EQUESTRIAN CANADA, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. EQUESTRIAN CANADA is committed to:

Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, is a primary consideration in all activities.

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment. Ensuring that owner, trainer, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.

Providing for the continuous wellbeing of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.

Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.

Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.

Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions. Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane. All participants at The Classics competitions are expected to abide by this Statement of Principle.

Please note the following when completing your entry forms.

**** As per Article A801 the person responsible for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares, responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC rules and is liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violation of the EC Rules. For the purposes of these Rules, the Person Responsible is normally the trainer, owner or competitor who rides or drives the horse during an event, or a parent or legal guardian in the case of junior competitors. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed in the stables by himself or herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. The Person Responsible must hold a valid EC Sport License in good standing at the same level or higher in which the horse is competing. However, when the competitor is a Junior, the competitor cannot be the Person Responsible and the Person Responsible may be a parent/guardian who must be at minimum an EC or USEF member in good standing. The Entry Form must list the Person responsible' name, their EC or USEF member number and must be signed.**

ELIGIBILITY FOR COMPETITION/PLAYOFFS

- All RIDERS, OWNERS and COACHES must provide proof of valid 2024: EC Bronze or EC SILVER for appropriate divisions listed herein, OE (Ontario Equestrian) and memberships must be provided prior to competing at ALL SHOWS. All RIDERS, OWNERS and COACHES must be current members in good standing before the first horse show for points to apply and remain in good standing all year long.
- Horses/ponies must have a valid EC recording number for all SILVER classes/divisions listed.
- The top twelve from each division will be eligible to compete at the Playoffs.
- Playoff entries must be completed online www.angelstone.showgroundslive.com by September 15th, 2024.

BRONZE DIVISIONS & CLASSES - HUNTER

Lead Line Class

\$10 – NOT INCLUDED IN PASS

1. Open to Juniors who have not passed their 10th birthday as of January 1, 2024. Riders may not cross enter any other class. Riders and ponies must be led by a capable handler 16 years and older.

Walk/Trot Hunter

Open to riders under the age of 10 as of January 1st, 2024. Open to horses and ponies. Riders showing in this division are only eligible to compete in the Cross Rail Hunters and Cross Rail Jumper. If entries warrant, this division may be split as follows: 10 and under, 11 and over as of January 1 of the current year.

3. Walk/Trot Hunter Under Saddle

Cross Rail Hunter Division

Open to all junior/amateur riders. Maximum 8 fences, no combinations. Open to horses and ponies, however, lines will not be adjusted. Riders showing in this division who have not also entered the Walk/Trot division are only eligible to compete in the Puddle Hunter, Cross Rail Jumper, 0.6m Jumper division, Flat division and corresponding Equitation Flat class. Courses will contain a maximum of eight obstacles and will contain no combination obstacles.

Puddle Hunters

Open to all junior/amateur riders. Maximum 8 fences, verticals only, max height 18". Open to horses and ponies. Lines will not be adjusted for ponies. Athletes showing may cross enter into the Cross Rail Hunter division OR into one of the following: Cross Rail Jumper, 0.6m Jumper, 2'0" Open Hunter, Hack division and corresponding Equitation Flat classes, but not both. Ideally horse/rider combinations are able to ride all lines with the same consistency in rhythm and pace. Attire per Article G109. Show management may split this division: 10 and under and 11+ based if entries warrant.

Children's Pony Hunter

PRESENTED BY MY BARN CHILD

Fence heights 2'0 and 2'3".

Open to athletes who are under 18 as of January 1, 2024. Open to all ponies. "A" Equitation Riders may only ride Large Ponies. Lines (distances) may not be adjusted for **less** than three ponies at each height. Declaration of height must be made on entry blank or at gate before start of class.

A/B/C EQUITATION DIVISIONS – BRONZE

A proper position and good schooling on the flat are the roadmap to success in the equitation divisions. They also lay the foundation for upward progression through the levels of training and competition. These divisions will be run over hunter type courses with a minimum of eight obstacles. Each Equitation Division (A/B/C) will qualify for the Playoffs.

The medal will never run prior to the Equitation over Fences but may run concurrently. (Back-to-back.)

A Equitation 2'9"

Open to Junior A athletes, who are 15, 16, 17 on January 1.

The medal class will be comprised of one phase only and must contain two appropriate tests within the course from EC Rule Book G1009, tests a – p.

Athletes on the flat may be required to perform tests from the EC Rule Book G1009, tests a – l, plus p.

Lines will not be adjusted for ponies.

93. North Zone Hunter Medal 2'9"

Originally created in the image of the Jump Canada Medal, the Silver Series Medal class has evolved into a specialty class and a favorite amongst the Hunter riders. Where contradiction exists, these specifications supersede those of the Equine Canada Jump Canada Medal. These classes are open to Junior and Amateur riders only. Riders may walk the course.

Jumping Phase: Over fences: Figure eight course of no less than eight jumps. Fences not to exceed 2'9. Class is judged in accordance with Article G1008 Class Routine Over Fences. No additional test over fences is permitted.

Flat Phase: All competitors who completed the course to a maximum of ten shall be called back to perform at the walk, trot, and canter. From a maximum of four competitors, the judge may call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009 Tests (Equine Canada Rule Book Section G).

Judging: Medal classes will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.

Tack & Equipment: All tack and equipment remain the same for both phases. Restrictions as per Article G1003 through G1005.

94. North Zone Jumper Medal .90m

Originally created in the image of the CET Medal, the Jumper Medal has evolved into a specialty class favorite to jumper riders. These specifications supersede those of the Equine Canada CET Medal. This class is open to Junior and Amateur riders only. It is judged with both a jumping and a flat phase.

Jumping Phase: The jumping phase should be over a course of at least nine (9) obstacles. Obstacles will not exceed 0.9m in height and spread. The course must contain at least one double or triple combination with at least one spread fence. Other spread fences are required elsewhere on the course. Liverpool is optional.

Flat Phase: All riders, or a maximum of twelve who complete the Jumping Phase, shall be called back to perform on the flat. During the flat phase, riders will show a working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising and showing a lengthening of stride, the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. The top four riders in the flat phase will be asked to complete a short test determined by the judge. When this test is being ridden, the riders will turn their backs so they cannot watch the other competitors.

Judging: Jumping phase is to be conducted under current Equine Canada jumper rules. In

addition, the class will be judged on seat, hand, guidance, and control.

Tack and Equipment: All tack and equipment must remain the same for both phases. Only running martingales used in a conventional manner are permitted. No Standing martingales, German martingales, draw reins or restricted running martingales are permitted. Conservative colored headgear (As per Article G1109) must be worn, with no additional adornment. Stirrups as per Article G1109-G).

Jumper Medal will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat.
